IT hiring down 49 per cent in August amid US economic crisis

New Delhi September 5, 2011



Recruitment by Indian information technology (IT) companies witnessed a slowdown in the month of August, owing to the crisis in the US and Europe region, but the overall hiring mood in the country is upbeat, says a survey.

The US accounts for almost 60 per cent of the revenues of the USD 60 billion Indian IT industry.

In contrast, other industries such as FMCG, banking, telecom and automobiles saw 14 per cent more recruitment in August, compared to July.

"This data shows the strong impact of the US and Euro crisis in Indian IT sector hiring. We had seen the overall hiring trend was healthy in the previous month, except the IT and ITeS sectors," MyHiringClub.com CEO Rajesh Kumar said.

"When discussed with some employers, they indicated it will take 2-3 more months for hiring from these sectors," he added.
